Back in the day folks couldn't spell and many could barely write, so how a name sounds is more



important than how it's spelled. Use wild card or Soundex searches to help find variant spellings of names.

ASSUME NOTHING

Check all your facts, don't assume that any particular document is right or wrong, and always try to find

other independent sources to corroborate your facts as much as possible. Verify, verify, verify. For instance, don't assume:

- your ancestors were married
- census information is accurate
- vital (or other) records were correct
- your ancestor's life events were recorded
- ancestors had the same name as their enslaver

USE DISCRETION

Never lie in your genealogy reports,

but use discretion when reporting family information, especially when it involves living relatives.

ALWAYS DOCUMENT YOUR SOURCES, NO MATTER HOW MUCH THEY CONTRADICT ONE ANOTHER

Over time, you will compile more data and those seemingly contradictory pieces of evidence

may prove to be just the pieces of the puzzle you need to prove or disprove your theory. Be consistent as you cite your sources. There are standard citation formats, but even if you just make up

your own format for listing your sources, be consistent with it. You want your descendants to be able to retrace your steps, so always cite your sources.

MOST DATES ARE APPROXIMATE

It's okay to state that someone was born "btw 1901-1903," "abt. 1845," or died "May 1915" if you don't have an exact date or where various

documents have different dates. Which date is "correct?" They all are.

IF UNSURE, SAY SO

Future researchers will thank you for being honest if you simply say that you cannot prove a specific fact, yet



you "suspect" such and such is true. Don't fudge the facts. Ever.

YOU CANNOT DO IT ALL ONLINE

Yes, we love doing research online and there's nothing better than using the computer to find new sources, view digital images of original documents and even connect



with relatives. For family historians, the Internet will never replace the wonderful work of libraries, county courthouses, archives, and historical societies. Do as

much as you can online, then turn off your computer and hit the bricks!

JUST BECAUSE IT'S ONLINE DOESN'T **MEAN IT'S TRUE**

The Internet is a wonderful thing but it's filled with oodles of bad information. Don't make the mistake of believing anything you find online at face value. Verify against other sources, even if you paid for the information you found online. Consult the original source whenever possible.

PASS ALONG YOUR RESEARCH

spend researching your family, your research will never be

done. Plan on passing along your research to the next generation's researchers. Leave excellent notes, cite

all your sources, explain your shorthand ... in essence, leave your

research the way you'd have liked to have found it.

SPREAD THE WORD

You have our permission to use/publish these Golden Rules as much as you like. Just give us credit for them, okay?

DON'T DIE WITH YOUR STORIES STILL IN YOU

Giving credit to Dr. Wayne Dyer for his "Don't die with your music still in you," we want to

remind you to tell the stories as completely and as accurately as possible. Genealogy isn't about just doing research. Genealogy is about telling the stories and ensuring



that your ancestor's legacies live on for generations to come. Without the stories, the research won't do anyone much good. The legacy of your ancestors rests in your capable hands. Doing the research is fine, but always remember that you have been chosen to tell their stories.

DNA IS NOT A TRUMP CARD

DNA is just one of **many** possible sources of information you can use to verify or deny a relationship. Human error occurs when the results are transcribed, thereby providing false information. DNA results should **always** be used in concert with other sources.

ANYTHING YOU POST ONLINE WILL BE "BORROWED"

You need to accept the fact that any family information you post online will be "borrowed" or outright stolen, and you will probably not get credit for all your hard work. This is the nature of the beast... the Internet. Get over it.

THE INTERNET IS CONSTANTLY **CHANGING**

Web sites change all the time, and to find the information you

need, you may need to look in new places to find old information. Take a second look at old sites you haven't visited in a while, and don't be afraid to walk away from your favorite sites if/when you find new ones that provides better information. Seek and you may find.

Use quotation marks to search for an exact phrase "Thomas Edward Frost"



Use an asterisk inside quotation marks to specify unknown words: "Thomas * Frost."



Use OR (capitalized) to search for multiple versions. of a name at once: "Thomas Frost" OR "Frost Thomas."



Use the minus sign to eliminate results with certain words: "Thomas Frost" -weather.



Search for words on specific websites, such as the local library or genealogical society: "Thomas Frost" site:hcgsohio.org.



Browse the Google News archive going back to the mid-1880s at <news.google.com/newspapers>.

Search for images like the one you have by dragging it onto the Google Images home page <images. google.com>.

1830

1870

Name; age; race; occupation; value of real estate; value of personal property; birthplace; whether parents were foreign born; month of birth if born within the year; month of marriage if married within the year; school attendance; literacy; whether deaf and dumb, blind, insane or idiotic; male citizens 21 and over, and number of such persons denied the right to vote for other than rebellion.

1880

Address; name; relationship to head of family; sex; race; age; marital status; born within the year; disabled so as to be unable to attend to ordinary business or duties; if so, what is the sickness ordisability; whether blind, deaf and dumb, idiotic, insane, maimed, crippled or bedridden; attended school within the year; ability to read and write; place of birth of person, father and mother.

1890

99% of the general schedules were destroyed by fire in 1921. Schedules for small parts of AL, DC, GA, IL, MN, NJ, NY, NC, OH, SD, & TX remain. Content was similar to that for the 1900 census.

Supplemental schedules for Union veterans of the Civil War and their widows survives for part of Kentucky and the states alphabetically afterKentucky.

1900

Address (street and house no. in large cities); relationship to head of family; color or race (White, Black, Chinese, Japanese, and Indian); month and year of birth, age at last birthday; marital status (single, married, divorced, widowed); number of years married to present spouse; number of children of wife; number of children living; place of birth of person and parents (state or country only); citizenship; if foreign born, year of immigration, and number of years in U.S.; citizenship status if over 21 (Alien, PA=declaration of intent filed, Naturalized); occupation; education – can read, write, and speak English; ownership of home (Owned, Rented); whether a House or a Farm; and whether Free or Mortgage.

Separate schedules were prepared for institutions, military establishments, and Indian reservations.

1910

Address; name; relationship to family head; sex; race;age; marital status; number of years of present marriage; for women, number of children born and number now living, birthplace and mother tongue of person and parents; if foreign born, year of immigration, whether naturalized, and whether able to speak English, or if not, language spoken; occupation, industry, and class of worker; if an employee, whether out of work during year; literacy; school attendance; homeowned or rented; if owned whether mortgaged; whether farm or house; whether a survivor of Union or Confederate Army or Navy; whether blind or deaf and dumb.

1910 (con't)

In addition to the above the special Indian Schedule also included the tribe of this Indian, tribe of father, tribe of mother, proportions of blood, and marriage information. It was to be used for Indians living on reservations or in tribal relations and also in certain counties containing a considerable number of Indians.

1920

Address; name; relationship to family head; sex; race; age as of January 1, 1920; marital status; if foreign born, year of immigration to the U.S., whether naturalized, and year of naturalization; school attendance; literacy; birthplace of person and parents; mother tongue of foreign born; abilityto speak English; occupation, industry, and class of worker; home owned or rented; if owned, whether free or mortgaged.

1950

Address; if live on a farm; name; relationship to head of house; race; sex; age at last birthday; marital status; birthplace; employment status for persons 14 years old and over; Supplementary questions were asked of persons listed in lines 4, 9, 14, 19, 24, and 29: Where living year ago; birthplace of parents; education; employment status; income; veteran information; Additional questions for person listed on line 29; additional employment information; number of marriages; if female, number of children.

- 1. **FamilySearch** A completely free genealogy database website. You can use an Advanced Search tool by surname, record type, and/or place to access millions of records. The FamilySearch Wiki is a "go to" resource to find what exists for a wide range of family history topics, even beyond FamilySearch's extensive databases.
- 2. U.S. Census Bureau Discover explanations on all federal census years and access copies of <u>original forms and questions</u>. Also see Census Online for links to state censuses; tools for research; and calculators to convert year of birth.
- 3. National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) Maintained by the U.S. Federal government, NARA houses millions of microfilmed, printed, and manuscript records. Excellent for census records; governmental and military history records; military pension files; product patents; also passenger lists, early naturalization records, and much more.
- 4. Library of Congress (LOC) One of the largest collections in the world of printed and recorded materials; outstanding source for free images; resource for all copyrighted materials in America and beyond. LOC maintains collections of nearly all city directories and county histories in the U.S.; houses a comprehensive directory of all known copyrighted newspapers by timeframe and where they can be located today, in the important U.S. Newspaper Directory and Chronicling America; and offers comprehensive historical materials of all kinds.
- 5. New York Public Library (NYPL) Among the elite tier of library collections, second only to LOC in the size and scope of its historical and genealogical collections. The NYPL Map Division has one of the best collections in the U.S.; the Milstein Division has extensive local history and genealogical materials related to the all fifty states, including one of the largest American collections of city directories on microfilm; other notable divisions are the Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture, Dorot Jewish Division, Manuscripts and Archives, Performing Arts Division, and the Science, Industry, and Business Library. Plus many accessible online digital collections and image galleries; and use of IntraLibrary Loan through ILL and your local library card.
- 6. **USGenWeb Project** Free county/state historical and genealogical resources; research resources and content projects driven by volunteers of

local and state genealogical societies throughout the United States. Also see **WorldGenWeb Project** for records beyond the U.S.

- 7. Research Guides for Ship Passenger Lists and Immigration Records Focuses on providing guidance and links to records for passenger lists from about 1820 to the early 1950s. It includes suggestions for finding records for ports of arrival and immigration records.
- 8. Allen County Public Library, Fort Wayne, Indiana Special collections include African American and a Native American Gateway; military records; and a surname database contributed by researchers. One of the largest genealogical library collections in the U.S.
- 9. Freedman's Bureau A Federal agency of the United States Department of War to help slaves who were set free after the Civil War and also poor whites with provisions, clothing, and fuel. It also helped with immediate and temporary shelter and supplied food and aid to the destitute and suffering.
- 10.Access Genealogy Access hundreds of links to genealogical data by state or by topic. Very helpful and handy website.
- 11.JewishGen An easy-to-use website with many record groups and good surname search facilities. Daitch-Mokotoff phonetic search algorithms for eastern European and Jewish name searches. Some databases require payment.
- 12.BillionGraves Search their free database by people or by cemetery. Many entries have photos of gravesites. Free app helps to direct you to the GPS location in a cemetery, which is a great help as many cemeteries are poorly marked.
- 13.**Find A Grave** They call themselves the world's largest gravesite collection with more than 170 million memorials. Search for free. Many photos and text has been added to gravesite information.
- 14.Legacy.com The global leader in online obituaries, partners with more than 1,500 newspapers and 3,500 funeral homes across the United States, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, the United Kingdom, and Europe. Consumers can also express condolences, share direct support for families, and celebrate the people who have touched their lives.
- 15. Afrigeneas.com An excellent starting place for African American genealogy. It features a "Beginners Guide" video; details on best sites for African American records, resources, and research; good direction on finding slave data, vital records, history of slavery; plus a website search function, forums and chats.

- 16.Rootsweb One of the first genealogical resources on the internet; it still offers excellent help with mailing lists; Ancestry Wiki; obituaries; connect to USGenWeb; Family Trees; queries; and more.
- 17.**Cyndi's List** Offers links organized by topics/categories. A crossreferenced index contains extensive lists of online genealogy resources. Don't know where to look for specific records? Check Cyndi's up-to-date list of suggested sources.
- 18. Society of American Archivists Laura Schmidt in "Using Archives: A <u>Guide to Effective Research</u>" provides an excellent tutorial on archives: what are archives, the types, requesting materials, visiting and guidelines, copyright, and more.
